On December 6, 1960, 30 men and their wives gathered at the Cactus Inn on North University where they become a chapter in the American Business Club. At that time the chapter name was La Mesa, today we are known as the Lubbock Monterey Chapter of AMBUCS.

Our mission is inspiring people to conquer challenges related to mobility and independence, through a nationwide network of volunteers, working in partnership with physical, occupational and speech therapists, by providing Amtryke adaptive trykes, scholarships for therapists and many forms of community service.

In 1961 they started their first fundraiser a restaurant at the South Plains Panhandle Fair, which is still one of their major fundraisers. They have also hosted other fundraisers during their 60 years of existence such as a Wine Walk and Summerfest.

Through the hard work and dedication of the membership they have been able to provide the community with:

A Challenger Little League program along with their own field at the Western Little League complex. A league that is designed for children with disabilities. The league has been in existence for 27 years.

On an average fiscal year we give away 30 of our therapeutic trykes at no cost to the recipient and average providing \$50,000 in scholarships per year to students in the Allied Health Program at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center.
